



NSW OFF ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

1 GENERAL

- 1.1 The NSW Off Road Championship is contested over a series of Short and Long course Off Road Race events, each one authorised by a CAMS Ltd. Event Permit and conducted throughout the course of one calendar year.

Events forming part of the New South Wales Off Road Championship, shall be conducted under the general provisions of the International Sporting Code of the Federation International de l'Automobile (FIA), the National Competition Rules (herein referred to as the NCR's); the Off Road Standing Regulations (herein referred to as the Off Road STR); these Sporting Regulations; the Event Supplementary Regulations; any Further regulations and any Bulletins as may be authorised by CAMS Ltd.

- 1.2 Each Event Promoter is required to pay to CAMS Ltd a Championship Participation Fee of \$165.00 for each event they conduct, together with an Entrant Levy, equal to \$5.00 for each entrant, who enters and participates in each event they conduct.

- 1.3 The Panel will use this fee for Promotion of Off Road Racing in NSW, to provide for the Championship trophies, for equipment purchases and the cost of meetings. CAMS will hold the levy fee in the NSW Off Road Fund Account.

- 1.4 **Participation Fee and Entrant Fee** are to be forwarded, at the conclusion of each event, to NSWORP P.O. **Box 129, SINGLETON. NSW. 2330**, so the panel can account for all fees received before forwarding fees to CAMS, Melbourne.

- 1.5 Clubs and/or Promoters of NSW Off Road Championship events are not permitted to conduct Club or Multi-Club Off Road Events within 10 days of a State or National Off Road event held in NSW.

- 1.6 Each Event Promoter of a NSW Off Road Championship event is required to forward, by E-mail, the results of their State Championship round to the NSW Off Road Championship Point scorer.

These results must be in the form of an MS Excel spreadsheet and must be forwarded immediately after the conclusion of each event.

The results format must contain a provision for noting whether each competitor has registered for participation in the NSW Off Road Championship Pointscore.

- 1.7 All Championship Event Supplementary Regulations, Entry Forms and all other associated event documentation is to be forwarded to the NSW Off Road Panel Secretary, for review by the panel, prior to being forwarded to CAMS for Event Permit authorisation.



2. CONDITIONS of ENTRY & ELIGIBILITY to GAIN POINTS.

- 2.1 Registration, with the NSW Off Road Panel, for the 2011 NSW Off Road Championship is required in order to be eligible to score Championship Points.

Each event entry form will include a 'checkbox', provided to indicate whether the entrant wishes to register for inclusion in the NSW Off Road Championship pointscore. Once registered, each competitor will be included in the Championship pointscore from that event onwards, until the conclusion of the championship.

- 2.2 Each Competitor must have contested at least three (3) rounds of the Championship to be included in the overall Championship results.
- 2.3 The final pointscore results will be based on the total accumulated results of every event contested by each competitor.
- 2.4 A non-registered crew/driver may enter an NSWORC event, but will only be eligible for event results and awards (not Points) and will be disregarded for the competition of the NSWORC point score.
- 2.5 Only the nominated No 1 Driver can receive Championship points. A driver can only nominate as No 1 driver for one vehicle in any one event.
- 2.6 The nominated No 1 Driver is required to drive the Prologue and majority of whatever event distance is completed by that vehicle in order to be awarded points.
- 2.7 In order to gain points, a Competitor must have a Competition time recorded in at least one heat or part thereof. (The Prologue is not classified as a Heat).
- 2.8 The Navigator Awards will go to the No1 Navigator, nominated by their Driver.
- 2.9 Each vehicle entering a round of the State Championship must have a CAMS log Book.
- 2.10 Each vehicle used to contest the NSW Off Road Championship is required to conform to the current CAMS Manual and CAMS website as shown in the "OFF ROAD GENERAL REQUIREMENTS and SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS". www.camsmanual.com.au
- 2.11 Vehicles can only be entered in the Class that they comply with.



3. EVENT FORMAT

- 3.1 Each event must make provision for a separate, designated refuel area within the pits. All refuelling of any competition vehicle, throughout the duration of each event, must be carried out in this designated area.
- 3.2 A Prologue will be run, in Classes where possible, to determine the overall Starting Order for the Event.
- 3.3 The Prologue Course should be a similar nature to the course proper.
- 3.4 A Competitor who does not complete the Prologue will be seeded by application to the Clerk of Course.
- 3.5 All heats will be started with the fastest cars to the front of the grid, descending to the slowest at the rear.
- 3.6 Amalgamation of classes, throughout each event will be permitted.
- 3.7 Provision must be made by the promoters to allow competitors to return to the pits during an event, and then return to the event if time permits.

Penalties may be imposed for not observing speed limits or official's instructions.

- 3.8 Each event must specify a Late Time Limit for each heat, within their event. Any competitor failing to complete the course within the Late Time Limit will be classified a Did Not Finish for that heat.

4. NSW CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS, PRIZE MONEY and AWARDS

- 4.1 Each registered competitor will gain Class Points and Outright points, according to the pointscore format shown below, as well as Five Class points for each event entered.

The Five Class points for event entry will be awarded to each competitor who pays the entry fee to enter the event and signs on at the event.
- 4.2 If any rounds are cancelled, the results will be taken from the remaining rounds that are run.
- 4.3 Promoters must give Awards to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place in each Class and to 1st Outright Driver and Navigator, if applicable.
- 4.4 In the event of a tied 1st in Class points, the Perpetual Trophies will be shared by each competitor for 6 months of the year.
- 4.5 Class winners at the end of each year will be given the opportunity to display their number in **RED** for the following year.
- 4.6 All Perpetual Trophies are required to be returned, in good order, to the NSW Off Road Panel Secretary in the **December of each year**.



5. POINTSCORE

5.1 Class position points will be awarded according to the following format, to 10th place in each Class.

Class Place	1st	2nd	3rd	4th	5th	6th	7th	8th	9th	10th
Points	20	15	12	10	8	6	4	3	2	1

In addition, each competitor will receive an additional five points on their Class Pointscore, for every event they enter and sign on as competitors.

5.2 Outright position points will be awarded according to the following format, to every registered competitor, up to 100th place outright.

Outright Place	1st	2nd	3rd	4th	5th	6th	7th	etc
Points	100	99	98	97	96	95	94	etc

5.3 **Prize Money** - the following prize money will be paid from the Levy Fund.

1st Top Class Point Scorer	\$500
2nd Top Class Point scorer	\$300
3rd Top Class Point scorer	\$200

In the event of a tie, these amounts will be shared.

6. EVENT SCHEDULE 2011

- Round 1 – Crookwell April 30th & may 1st
- Round 2 – Wittittrin May 28th & 29th
- Round 3 – Dondingalong July 9th & 10th
- Round 4 – Milbrodale August 27th & 28th
- Round 5 – Warialda September 24th 25th
- Round 6 – Nabitac October 29th & 30th
- Round 7 – Colo November 19th & 20th
